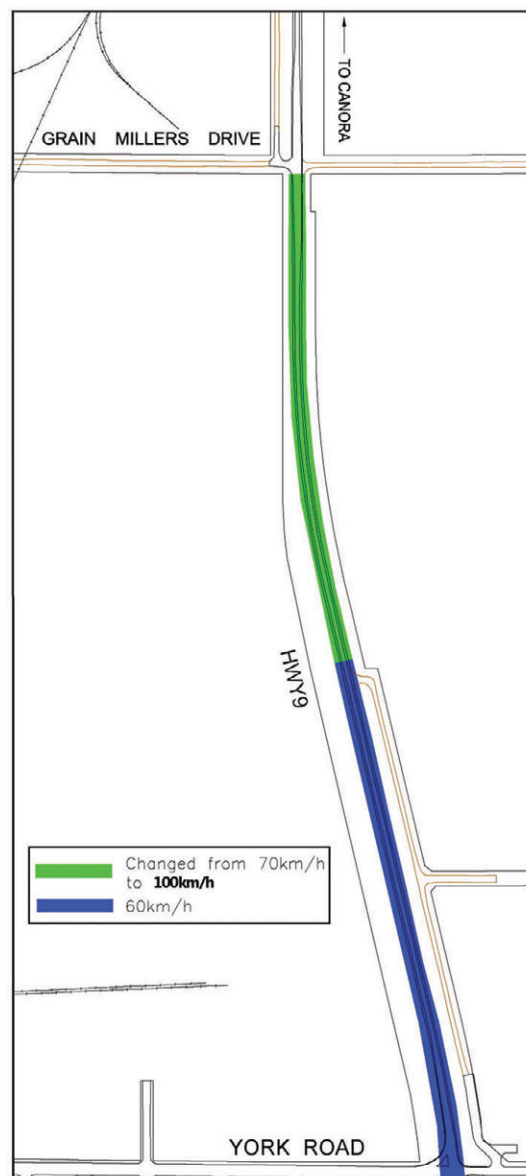

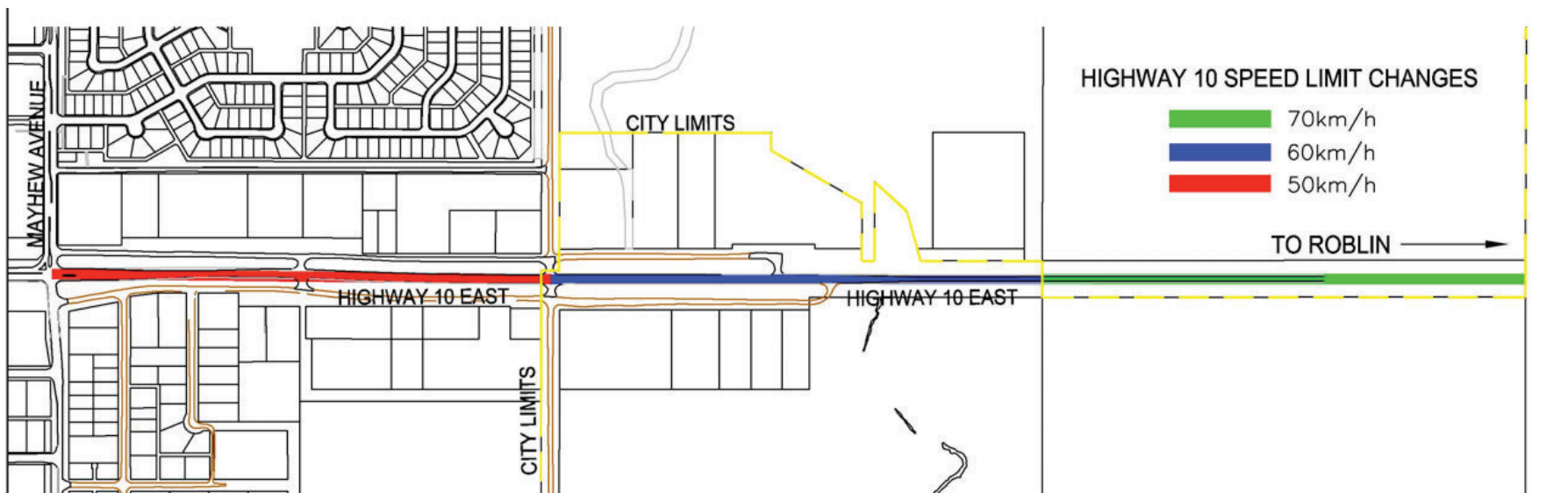
NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Speed Limit Changes – Highway #10 East

To help improve safety, the City of Yorkton is changing the following speed limits along Highway #10 East. This was done in conjunction with the Department of Highways and the RCMP.

A 70 km/hr zone will start at the eastern most city limit gradually decreasing to 50 km/hr one mile to the west at the road known as "Husky Road". The changes to the speed zones are detailed on the map below.
